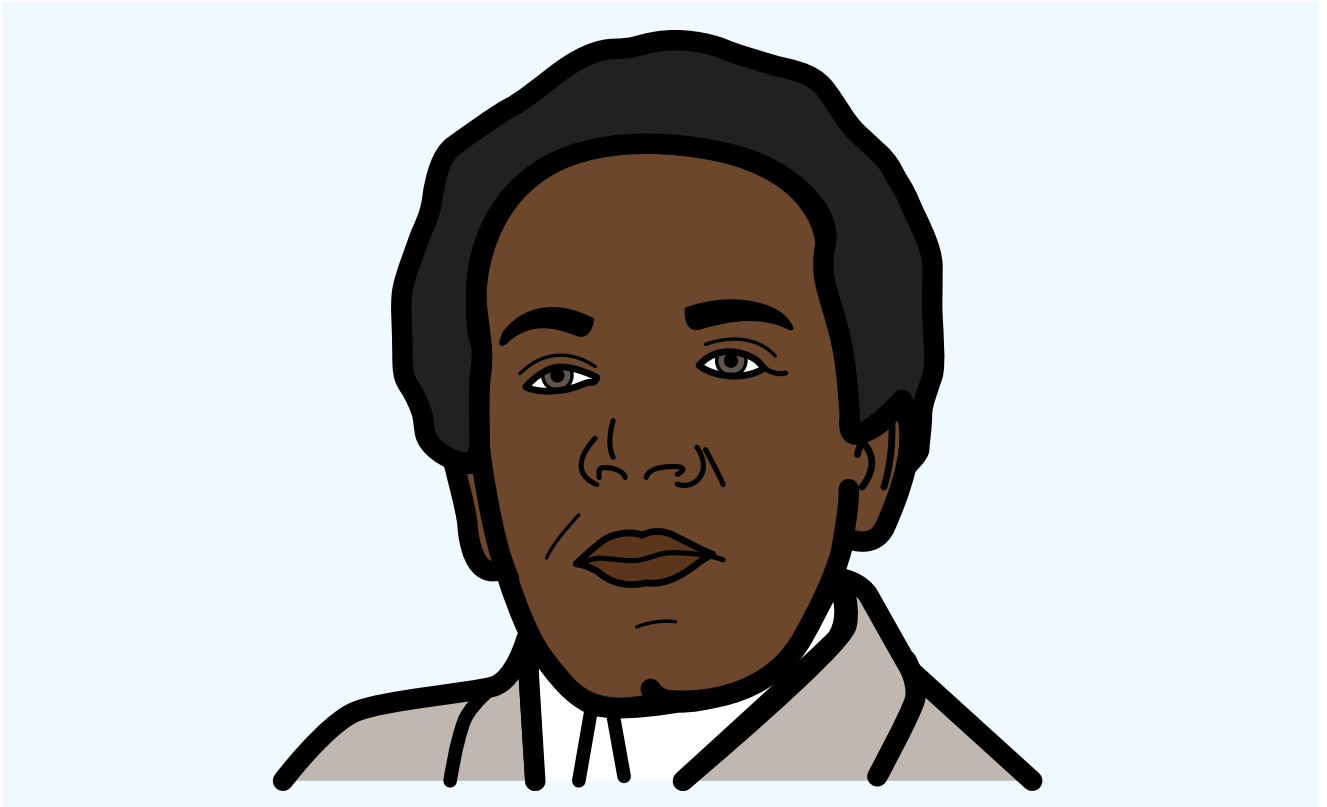

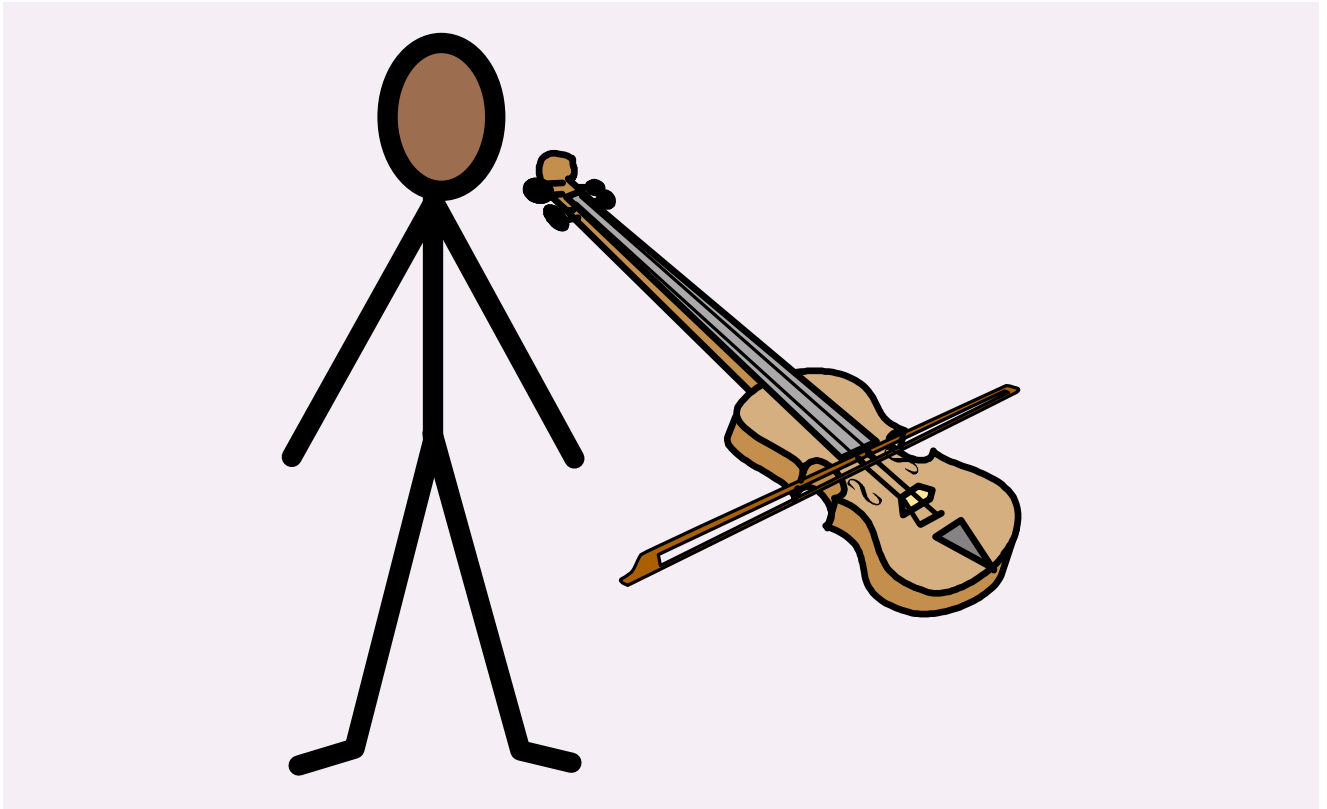


Samuel Coleridge-Taylor was born in London in 1875.

They both became musicians when they grew up.

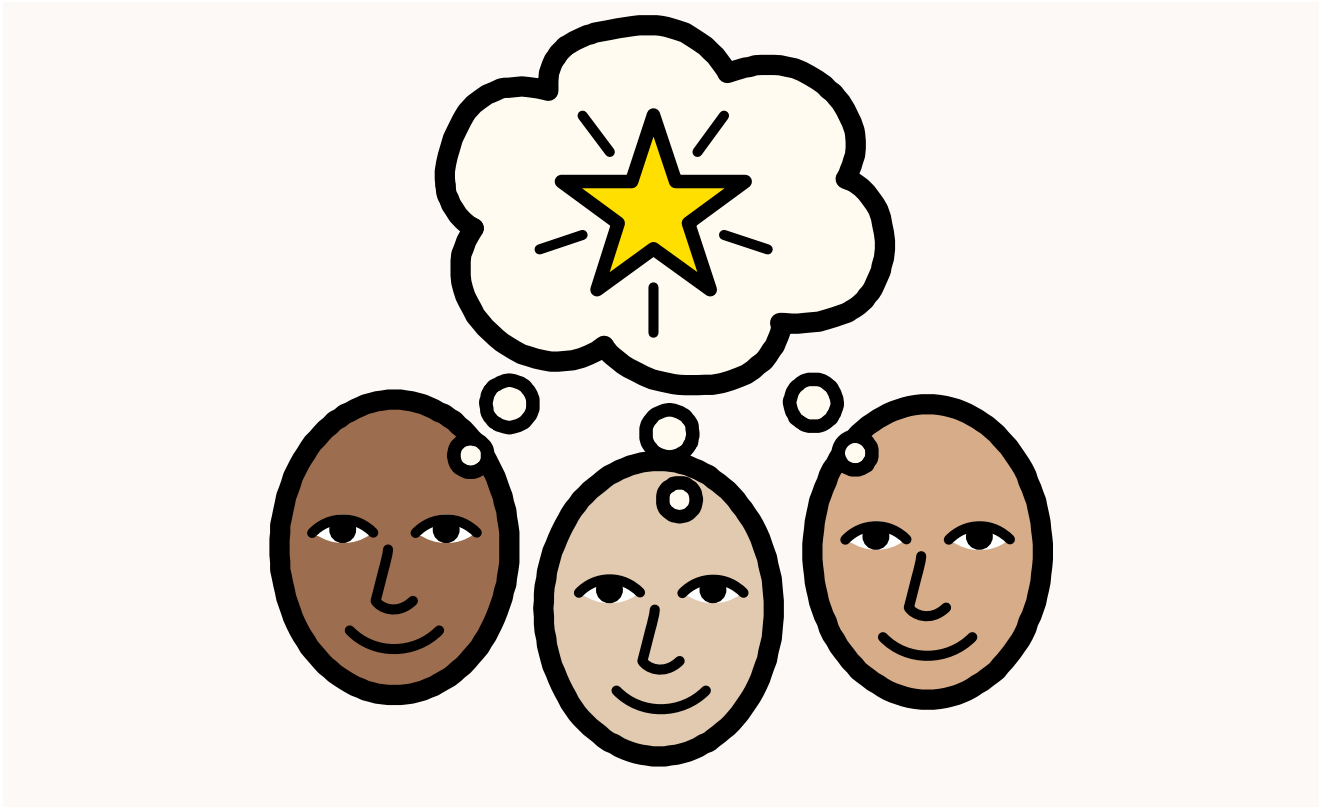


Samuel composed 'The Song of Hiawatha'.

He conducted American orchestras playing his music.

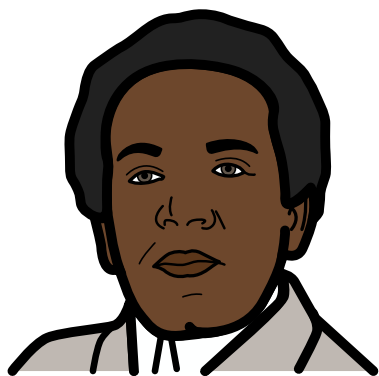


Samuel became ill and died aged 37.

The king gave Samuel's wife money to live on.



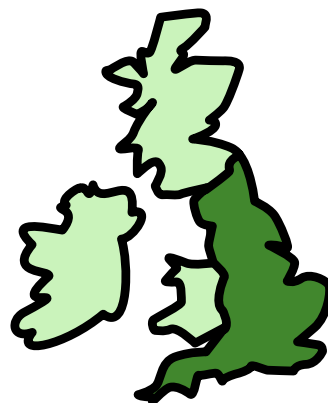
