

Later she liked her mother and sister more.



At first Pepys wrote his diary for himself.

But he re-wrote it and bound it into 6 volumes.

At first Anne wrote her diary for herself.

Later on she re-wrote it for other people to read.



Pepys' diary tells a lot about the 17th Century.

It is a valuable resource 400 years later.

Anne's diary tells a lot about World war 2.

It is extremely valuable 70 years later.
