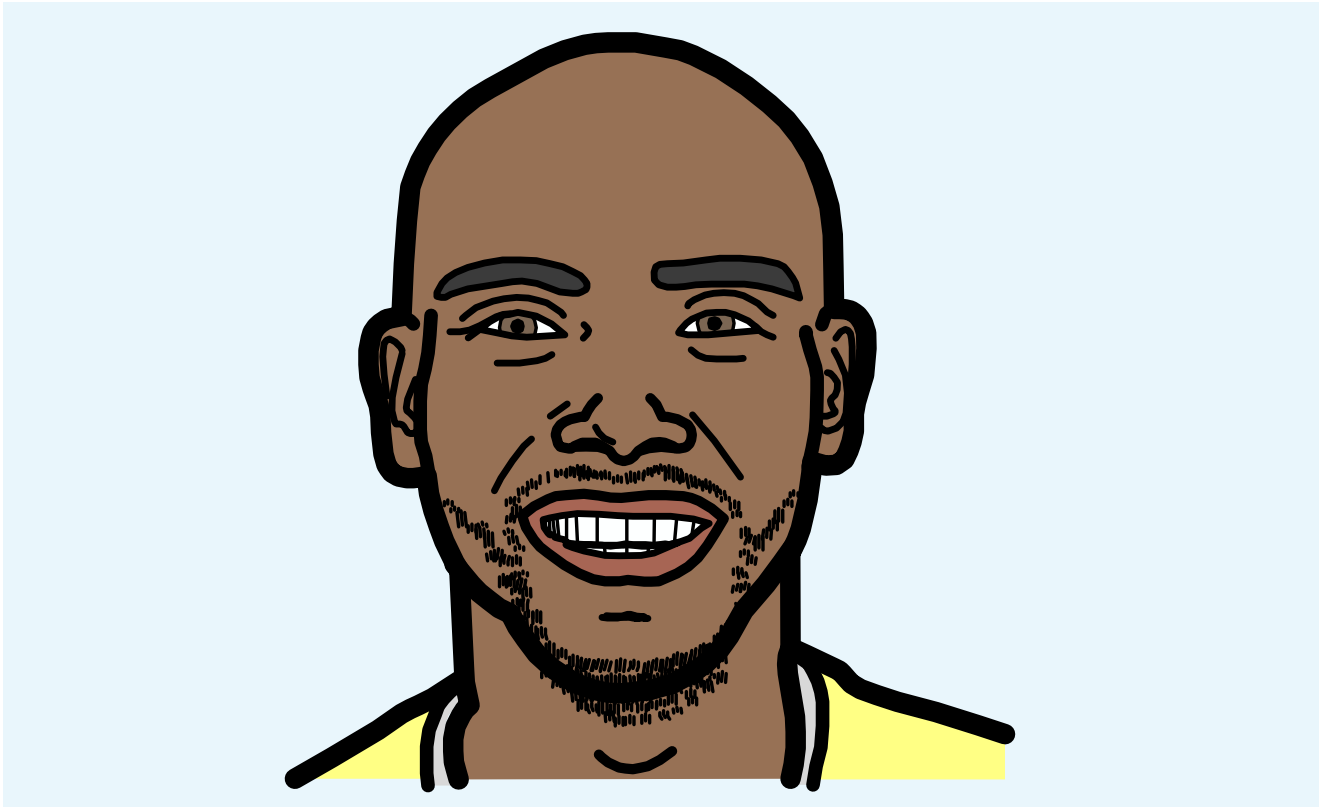

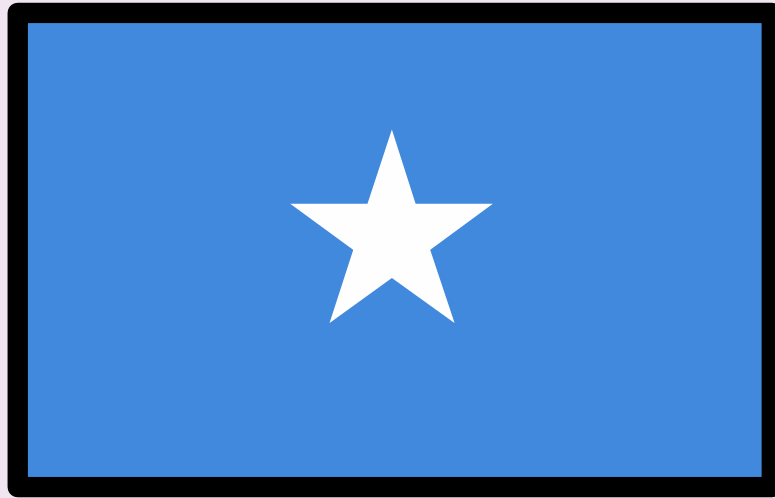


Sir Mo Farah was born in Somalia in 1983.

Mo then became separated from his mother.

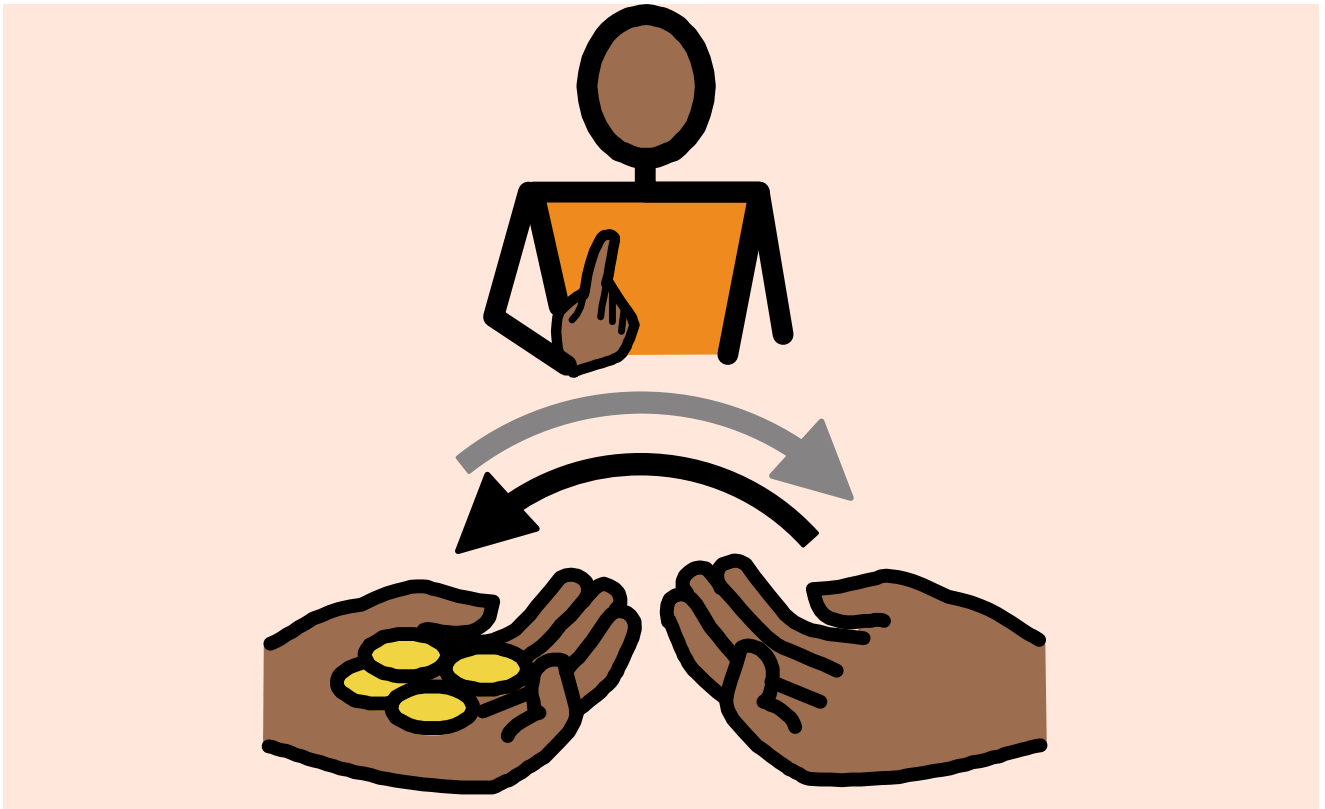


Mo spent his early childhood in Somalia and Djibouti.

Mo had to look after another family's children.

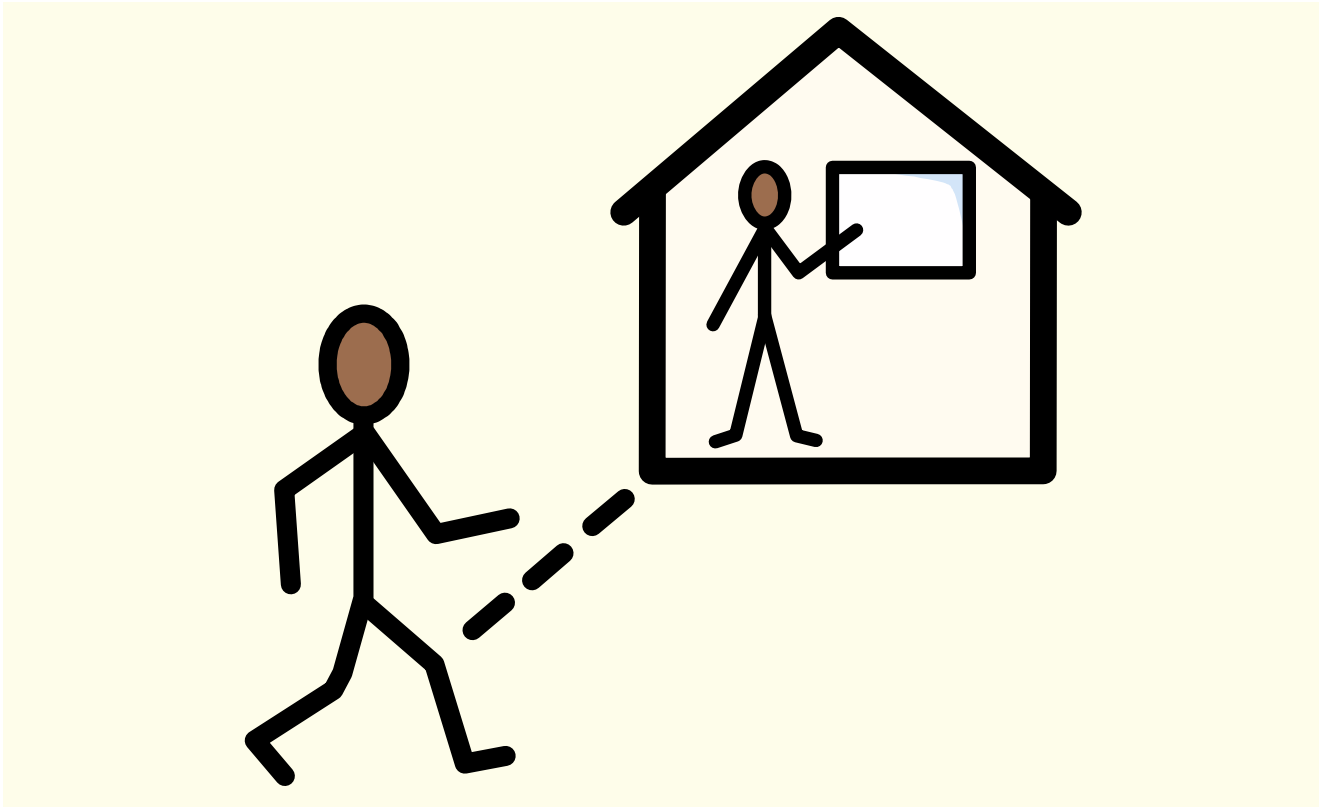


What happened to Mo is called trafficking.

Aged 12 Mo was allowed to go to school.

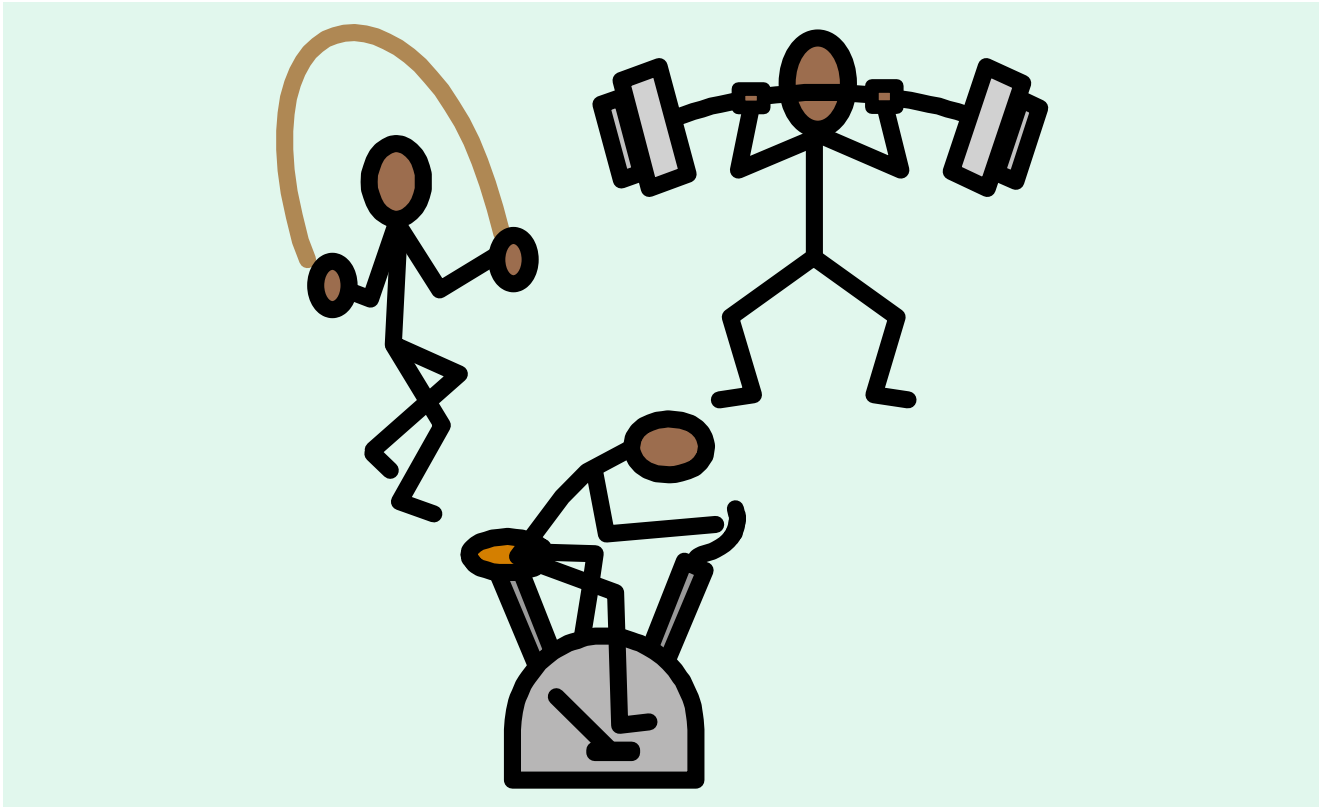


Mo was very talented at football and running.

Mo became very famous and very popular.

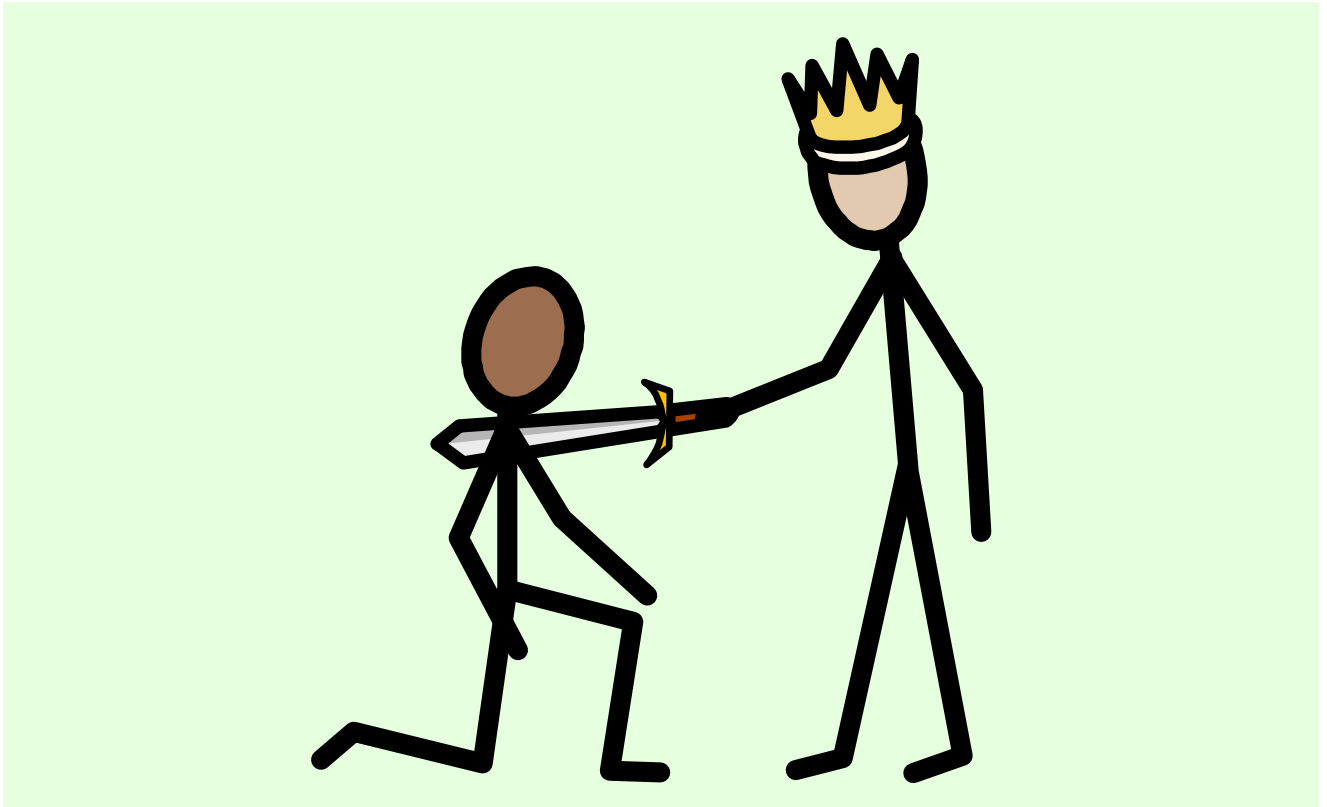


In 2016 Mo competed in the Olympics in Rio.

Mo has won the most athletics gold medals for Britain.

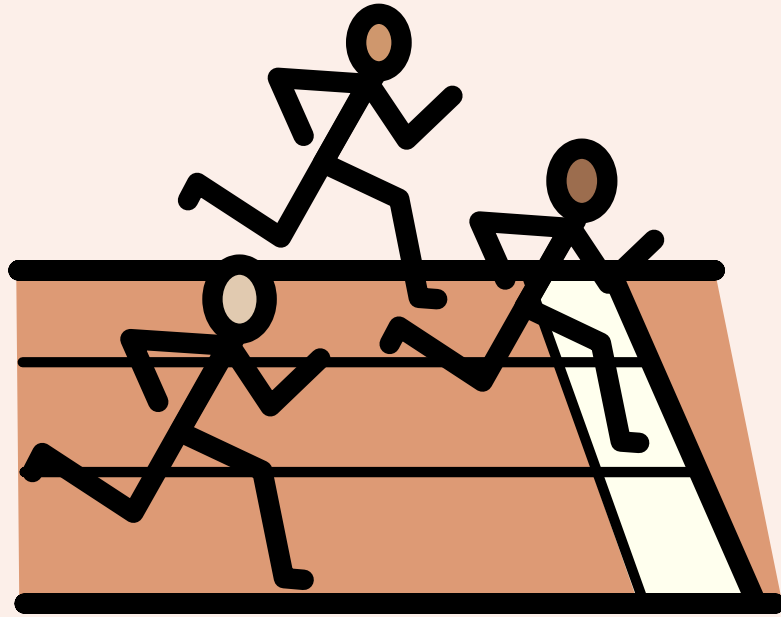


In 2013 Mo was honoured with a CBE.

He became Sir Mo Farah.

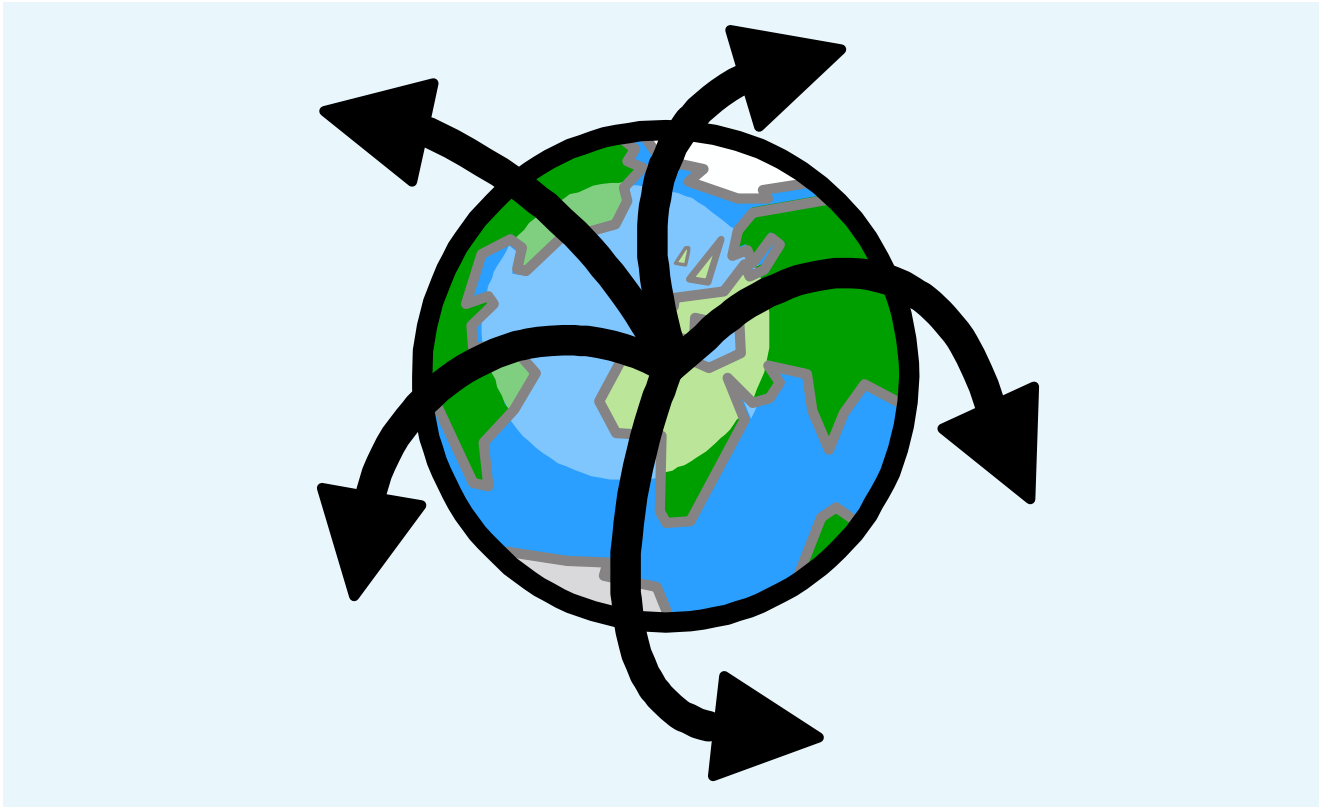


Mo retired from track events in 2017.

In 2018 Mo won the Chicago Marathon in the USA.

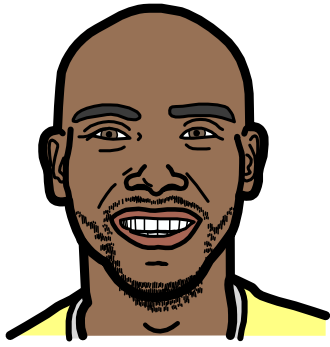


Mo won 10 global championship gold medals.

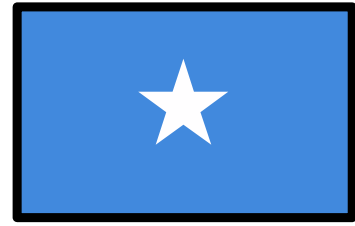
These included 4 Olympic golds medals.

Mo is the most successful British track athlete.

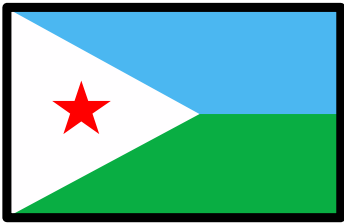
Mo is the most successful long distance runner ever.



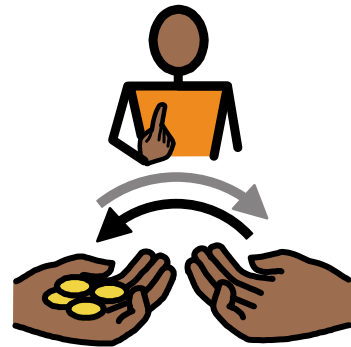
